## BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT POLICY

### Children and theatre are a match made in heaven!

- Theatre is an art form.
- The essence of art is creativity.
- Creativity requires a lively, curious, spontaneous freedom of heart, mind and body.
- In order for creativity to happen, an environment must exist in which participants feel relaxed, safe and focused.

### Discipline and Behavior Management Policy

In order for a participant to feel secure and cared for, certain guidelines need to be set and action taken if the participant steps out of these boundaries. A standard discipline procedure has been established so that all participants will be treated fairly. If a participant consistently disrupts a group or causes trouble that affects his/her safety or that of other participants, the following procedures will be followed:

1. First disruption: Quiet reprimand/verbal warning.
2. Second disruption: Brief "time out" in a space separate from the rest of the group.
3. Third disruption: Three "time outs" in a day will result in a one-day suspension from the program. This step will only be used one time with a child. Parent/Guardian will be contacted by ACMC staff.
4. If a child is suspended for a day, no further problems will be tolerated. At the next disruption, the participant will be dismissed from the program, and no refund will be given.
5. For severe offenses, such as, but not limited to, fighting, theft, vandalism, hitting a teacher or other participant, running away from a teacher, possession of weapons or drugs, or sexual misconduct, the participant will be dismissed from the program immediately. This will also occur with instances judged unacceptable by the staff and/or agents of ACMC.

Praise and positive reinforcement are effective methods of behavior management. When participants receive positive, non-violent and understanding indicators, they develop good self-esteem, problem solving skills and self-discipline.

#### **WE DO:**

- Praise, reward and encourage
- Reason with and set limits
- Model appropriate behavior
- Modify the camp environment to attempt to prevent problems before they occur
- Listen
- Provide alternatives for inappropriate behavior
- Provide logical consequences for his/her behavior
- Ignore minor misbehavior
- Explain things
- Use short, supervised periods of "Time Out"
- Stay consistent with our behavior management

#### **WE DO NOT:**

- Spank, bite, pinch or physically punish
- Make fun of, yell, threaten, make sarcastic remarks, use profanity or verbally abuse
- Shame
- Deny food and/or rest as punishment or relate discipline to eating or resting
- Leave the participant alone, unattended or without supervision
- Place the participant in locked rooms or closets as punishment
- Allow discipline of a participant by other participants
